Aims of the Higher University Degree (MA) (Section 12, 1.8.2005)

- 1. The education shall provide the student with:
 - e education shall provide the student with:
 good overall knowledge of the major subject or a
 corresponding entity and conversance with the fundamentals
 of the minor subject or good knowledge of the advanced
 studies included in the degree programme;
 knowledge and skills needed to apply scientific knowledge
 and scientific methods or knowledge and skills needed for
 independent and demanding artistic work;
 knowledge and skills needed for independently operating as
 an expert and developer of the field;
 knowledge and skills needed for scientific or artistic
 postgraduate education; and
 good language and communication skills

 - good language and communication skills.
- 2. The education shall be based on scientific research or artistic activity and professional practices in the field.

Preliminary findings

- · Objectives are defined in different ways
- The level of intentional mastering of the major differs very much especially in old curricula
- Module based structure makes the aims and the function of different components explicit
- Differences between universities exist and are motivated by research (personnel) based profiles
- Some efforts to competence based education exist
